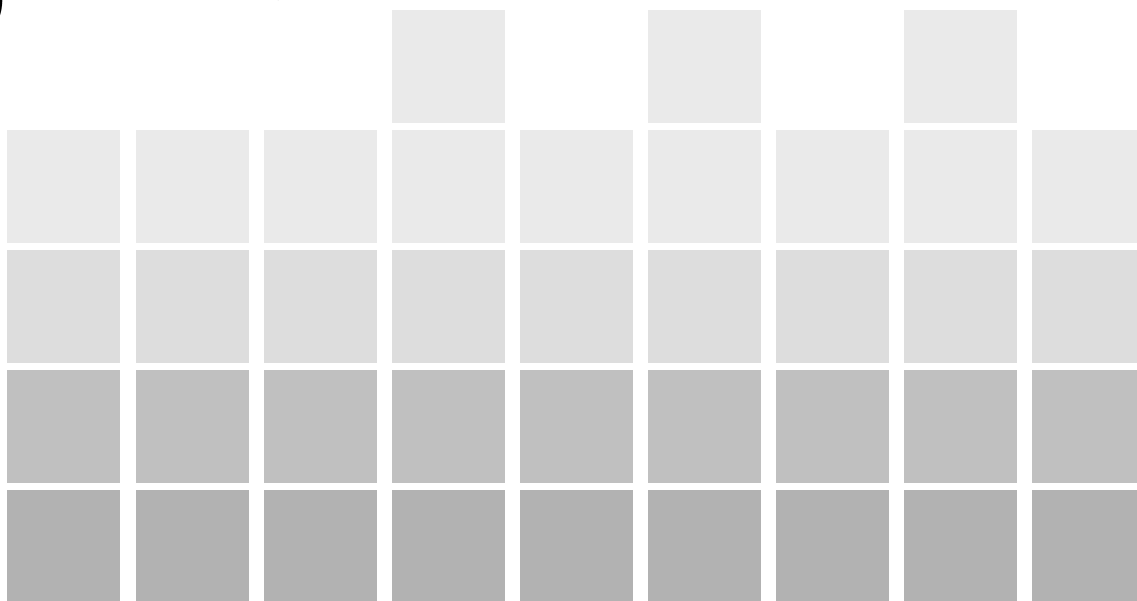

Students are requested to attend a learning skill course (course fee not included in the degree program tuition fee) and to get passed before enrolling in the 24 subjects listed above.

Course Delivery

The course is offered and is intended for students to undertake on a part-time basis. There will be sufficient units offered per trimester to enable students to progress at a reasonable rate.

For the purpose of enhancing overall quality and students' progress, a mixed mode delivery has been selected for this program.

Local classes are conducted to enable a regular face-to-face interaction either in the form of lectures, seminars, workshops and projects. Visiting academic staff will conduct intensive block teaching for a period of two days for each unit and a total of four days each trimester.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

The language of instruction will be English. All course content, workbooks and textbooks will conform with the requirements and standards set by The University of New England.

DURATION OF THE COURSE

The program is designed to enable the completion of the award in 2 to 4 years on a part-time basis, depending on the level of advanced standing granted.

It is expected that Senior Inspectors or equivalent with more than eight years service who have completed a 3-month full-time Investigators Course or equivalent would be granted advanced standing for up to 50 per cent of the degree.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Participants will normally be practicing police officers or law enforcement and security professionals.

The SCS CUHK will offer a number of diploma modules with localized content. Students who complete these modules will be admitted to Bachelor of Professional Studies with advanced standing.

English language proficiency

All applicants must provide evidence of their proficiency in the English language. One of the

following will be accepted:

1. An overall band score of at least 6 in the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) with a minimum of 5.5 in each sub-test. (This test is administered by the Australian Education Centre and by the British Council.) For enquiry, Australian Education Centre: 2827 6362 and British Council: 2519 9709.
2. A score of at least 550 in the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). For enquiry, Hong Kong Examination Authority: 2328 0061.
3. A pass in English in the Hong Kong Certificate Examination (Syb. B).
4. Completion of a diploma at a College or University where the language of instruction was English.
5. Holders of the diploma programs in Disciplinary Forces offered by SCS, CUHK.
6. Other examinations or tests will be assessed on their merits.

TUITION FEE

The tuition fee will be A\$1250 per unit. Students are required to pay by 8 installments. In the 1st installment, they have to pay the fee for 3 modules; while the remaining charges will be paid in the 2nd to 8th installments respectively. Tuition fee is to be paid before the course commences. Tuition fees must be paid in full in **Australian dollars**. Please note that tuition fees include all lectures and assessment but do not include textbooks for each subject. ***All fees paid are neither refundable nor transferable.***

Note: The course will not commence unless there are sufficient enrolments.

ACADEMIC STAFF

Qualified and experienced lecturers will be provided from The University of New England.

Local tutorials/lectures will be conducted by experienced SCS Instructors or instructors from other tertiary institutes or the Hong Kong Disciplinary Force / Security industry.

 - A. Highest educational certificate, e.g. Hong Kong Certificate Examination, Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination, Hong Kong Higher Level Examination, GCE Examination, etc.
 - B. Proof of English language proficiency, e.g. HKCEE English Language (Syb. B), IELTS, TOEFL.
 - C. Supporting Documents for working experience, previous studies and training
 - D. Hong Kong Identity Card or relevant Identification Document.
2. An application fee of HK\$250 by crossed cheque or bank draft made payable to "**The Chinese University of Hong Kong**".
Application fees are not refundable.

Note: Those who apply for advanced standing should state this in their application form and support this by relevant documentation.

Applicants of Senior Inspector rank or above should provide a summary of their training courses (with an estimation of hours if applicable) supported by a portfolio of evidence so that an assessment can be made.
